Re-imagined Library Awarded

The Boyup Brook library has been recognised for providing outstanding service to the community at this year's Library Board Awards.

The Shire of Boyup Brook received a Library Board of Western Australia Award for Innovation and Collaboration in the Small Regional Communities category, for its Public Library Reimagined initiative.

This project saw the local library relocated to the Boyup Brook Community Resource Centre, providing a catalyst for the introduction of new and improved services which has been praised for engaging community members of all ages.

Chairman of the Library Board of WA, the Hon. John Day, said that the Innovation and Collaboration Award provided recognition for libraries in local communities. "Libraries not only provide essential services to people of all ages and backgrounds; they connect people, they are meeting places and places that provide access to information in both digital and physical formats. Libraries are community hubs that provide a fantastic example of the innovation and bright ideas that libraries are increasingly known for, regardless of their size or resources."

CRC Centre Manager, Jodi Nield said, "It is a thrill to receive this award to share how successful the relocation of the library to the CRC has been for our community. In 18 months, we have grown library membership, usage numbers and introduced some great programs. We are very thankful for the support of the Shire of Boyup Brook, the CRC committee, our amazing staff and of course, the Boyup Brook community".

High Yielding Farmers

After a successful 2022 growing season, two Scotts Brook farmers were recognised in the Hyper Yielding Crops (HYC) Awards in July.

Charles Caldwell took out the WA barley award with 7.76t/ha crop of RGT Planet (84 percent of potential). He attributes this success to careful management of disease, weeds and nutrients and the team he had behind him.

He thanked this team, which included his supportive family, agronomists from Kojonup and Boyup Brook Agricultural Supplies, Dan Glover from CSBP and farm worker Ben Mead.

Ben Webb received his award in the WA wheat category, for a yield of 6.54t/ha crop of Rockstar (79 percent of potential). He said he was a little shocked by the win, but also accredited his agronomy team at Farmnco and a good year with no frost.

He said the paddock had good rotation and was deepploughed, and he seeded a newer, longer season variety of wheat that had become available, which is more suited to the southwest region.

Award winners receive a trophy and all who enter the competition receive a very detailed report on paddock soil, plant and grain nutrient analysis, as well as input costings and evaluation, and Charles said this information is invaluable.

This was the third year for the HYC awards, which is an initiative by the Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) and led by FAR Australia. They aim to "push the economically attainable yield boundaries of wheat, barley and canola."

Current Projects Around the Shire



WASTEWATER SYSTEM The sweet smell of roses will soon be back in the air with Council resolving to prioritise the installation of a new wastewater system at the Boyup Brook Visitor Centre. On completion of the project the grassed area at the back of the Tourist Centre will be able to be enjoyed by the community and visitors to our beautiful town, eliminating the need to often close the toilets when hosting events. This project has commenced early with the ablutions scheduled to be completed by the end of July. The re-installation of gardens and lawn will follow.



COMMUNITY HALLS Dinninup Halls have received power upgrades to both halls, had broken windows replaced and will be having a wall fixed in the large hall. Drainage works to the Kulikup Hall has been completed along with new guttering. McAlinden Hall has had a new water tank installed along with new guttering, they will also have the power re-instated. Mayanup Hall has had airconditioning installed, two new water tanks and will be installing a new oven. Wilga Hall has had new decking which was completed in March, while the Tonebridge Country Club has had asbestos removed and the interior walls replaced.

CEMETERY The Shire has received the geotechnical report prepared by WML Consulting Engineers and has appointed drainage engineers Porter Consulting. Once all information has been received and required works identified, a plan will be determined to identify priority works.

RETICULATION The Shire will be commencing upgrades to the reticulation system at our sporting precinct, including the Music Park, over the months of September and October 2023. Works have been scheduled to commence on the 11th September, at the end of the football season, and should take approximately one month to complete. The upgrades will help us achieve improved water efficiency throughout the sporting grounds.

TOWN HALL Works are continuing at the Town Hall and are on track for completion at the end of August 2023. Essential structural works have commenced to ensure the integrity of the building is maintained. The lesser hall has had a new subfloor and new floorboards laid, new exterior doors fitted and will also have a new portico and front entry.

It is a digital version of a paper script and is a convenient and efficient way to get your medicines from your pharmacy. It's sent to you by text or email from your doctor and appears in the form of a QR code. To receive an eScript, please ensure your details are up to date with the medical centre. Are eScripts safe? Yes they are, your details are kept secure and your script can only be 'unlocked' by your pharmacist. Not ready to change over to eScripts? Boyup Brook Medical Services will

still offer paper scripts, the choice is entirely yours. Rural Road Numbering

Rural Road Numbering is the style of property addressing used for rural and semi-rural areas in Western Australia and was introduced to assist emergency services and service providers to locate properties more easily in urgent circumstances. Rural road numbers are allocated based on how far your property entrance is from the start of the road, with odd numbers allocated on the left side of the road and even numbers allocated on the right. For example, a property numbered 327 would be located on the left-hand side of the road 3.27km from the start of the road. It's important to remember that the number becomes your property's house number, it doesn't replace your lot number or Certificate of Title details.





Winter Grading Programme

The winter grading programme is on schedule with roads in stage 2 now 90% completed and stage 3 now 78% completed. 





Abroad Adventures for Student

It has been an adventurous July for Boyup Brook local Cameron Nield, as he journeyed to Cambodia to teach English as part of a volunteer program. Cameron is currently in his third year of studying at Murdoch University, to become a primary school teacher.

Through the non-for-profit organisations of Challenges Abroad and the Future Sense Foundation, he was given the opportunity to travel to take part in the Cambodia Community Challenge program, a two-week experience that aims to work with, and teach primary school aged students conversational English.

Cameron explained his motivation to pursue this experience, "One of the main interests for my future as a teacher, is teaching English as a second language in a foreign country. This program gave me the perfect opportunity to do this, and the country of Cambodia has always fascinated me."

Cameron worked with students in the rural areas of the province of Battambang, in the North-West of the country. As Cambodia is still a developing country, schools heavily rely on foreign aid. Organisations such as Challenges Abroad and Future Sense regularly have students from Australia and the UK completing programs with these schools to help support them.

"Schooling in Cambodia is unlike anything I've experienced. You have students from ages 8 up to 16 in the same classroom, and a lot of them are only able to go to school for half a day," Cameron stated.







Consumer Protection Column

Avoid Tax Time Scams

Ongoing cost of living pressures mean many Western Australians will be looking forward to receiving tax refunds, but the end of a financial year is also a time when scammers emerge with false promises of monetary windfalls.

In a sign scammers are once again ramping up their tax-time efforts, our WA ScamNet team has received reports of a phishing email claiming to be from the Australian Tax Office (ATO), but is actually from an unrelated email address.

The fake email (which even comes with stolen Australian Government logos) promises a refund of several hundred dollars, but only if the recipient sends across their personal and financial information in return. The scammers would then likely use this information to commit identity theft and steal money.

Unfortunately this email is just one of many ways scammers target their potential victims, with more than 19,000 scam reports received by the ATO during the last financial year alone.

Along with text messages and threatening phone calls, scammers are increasingly turning to social media. Both the ATO and myGov have expressed concerns about fake social media accounts impersonating their organisations, staff and senior executives that ask users to send a direct message so they can make phony offers of help with taxes or fake refunds.

No matter how you're contacted, the best way to stay safe from tax-time scammers is to 'practice the pause' on calls, emails and messages that come out of the blue and never send your information to someone you don't know or trust.

For social media messages, investigate the account that has messaged you – look for verified ticks showing the account is genuine, then check the follower numbers and recent activity for any red-flags. On emails, click or hover over the sender's name to find the full email address. If you receive a phone call, hang up and call back the organisation using contact details you have independently sourced.



The Voice Information

A Voice to Parliament would be a permanent body to make representations to the Australian Parliament and the Executive Government on legislation and policy of significance to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

It would further the self-determination of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, by giving them a greater say on matters that affect them.

The following are the design principles of the Voice to Parliament agreed by the First Nations Referendum Working Group:

- The Voice will give independent advice to the Parliament and Government
- The Voice will be chosen by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people based on the wishes of local communities
- The Voice will be representative of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities, gender balanced and include youth
- The Voice will be empowering, community-led, inclusive, respectful and culturally informed
- o The Voice will be accountable and transparent
- The Voice will work alongside existing organisations and traditional structures



The word for today is – change your thinking, change your life.





Each day was well attended by up to 19 riders with over 25 riders attending over the camp, both local and travelling from as far as Albany, Dumbleyung and Margaret River.


Riders were put through their paces in ground work, dressage, games, jumping, carriage driving and some gymnastic and
