Remembrance Day

World Shearing Records

Boyup Brook residents Koen Black and Floyde Neil have set new shearing world records in October and November at properties in Kulikup and Kojonup.

Koen of Lojik – Shearing Training, broke the 8hour Merino Lamb shearing record on Thursday, October 27 by more than 30 sheep.

Managing to shear 604 sheep in the time frame, he beat the previous record which was made by his older brother twenty years ago, when Koen was just six years old!

Less than three weeks later on Sunday, November 13 Floyde of Shear Pride, broke the world record for the 8hour Crossbred Lambs category, shearing 527 in the time frame.

Floyde tallied 132, 126, 140 and 129 lambs during four, two-hour runs.

He broke the record by three sheep.

Well done Koen and Floyde!





Co-op Supports Community

The Boyup Brook Co-operative is proud to announce a donation of just over \$35,000 from its Community Fund benefitting both the Boyup Brook Hospital and the Senior Citizens Lodge.

The Community Fund was established by the board in 2020 with the aim of providing financial support for specialised projects and objectives within our community.

The first donation of \$25,800 will go towards the purchase of a lifesaving Hamilton T1 Ventilator machine for the Boyup Brook Hospital. This will replace the current unit which has limitations including only providing invasive ventilation and requires trained staff. The Hamilton T1 can be used on all patients including children to the elderly and can be operated easily by staff guided by telehealth.

Chairman of the Boyup Brook Co-operative Board Michael Wright said, "We are delighted to be able to support our local hospital with this donation and look forward to the Hamilton T1 machine being available to assist those patients who require it at their most critical time".

The second donation of \$10,650 consisted of the purchase and construction of a patio for the courtyard area of the Boyup Brook Citizens Lodge. This will allow the residents to enjoy the outdoor area with their guests without getting sunburnt or wet.

Manager of the Lodge Maria Bogar said, "We are thrilled with this very generous gift and look forward to the weather improving so our residents can enjoy more morning teas and lunches outdoors with their guests".

The Boyup Brook Art Awards is held as a key fringe event of the Country Music Festival each February, however it has not been conducted for the past two years due to COVID restrictions.

Unfortunately, this year, due to scheduled upgrades on the Town Hall, the Art Awards will also be postponed for another year, however, the Boyup Brook CRC will host a smaller scale art competition and exhibition entitled 'Focus on Flora' across the period of the Festival, February 17 to 19.

Artists are encouraged to enter using any media (except photography), as long as the main feature is 'FLORA'. Entries are to be no greater than 75cm on the longest side, with sculptures no greater than 1m in height. The entry fee is \$15 per piece, with a limit of three entries per person.

Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place with a special prize for Under 18 entrants. There will be a Packers' Prize and the public will have the chance to vote for the People's Choice.

Artworks should be made available for sale by the entrant.

The closing date for entries is Friday, January 27 2023, however depending on available space, the number of total entries may be capped and the closing date made earlier.



What to do When an Emergency Vehicle Approaches

Every few minutes an emergency vehicle will activate its lights and sirens to assist someone in a life-threatening situation. The driver of this vehicle is trained in emergency driving and their aim is to do this safely. Some road users are unsure about their obligations and options when an emergency vehicle approaches. The Road traffic Act 2000 in Western Australia states that, "A driver shall give way to and make every reasonable effort to give a clear and uninterrupted passage to, every police or emergency vehicle that is displaying a flashing blue or red light (whether or not it is also displaying other lights) or sounding an alarm."

Here's a simple guide to staying safe when making way for an emergency vehicle.

- If you hear a siren or see flashing red-and-blue lights and stay calm
- Look for somewhere safe to pull to the left and, if necessary, stop
- On the approach to a bend or the crest of a hill, keep going and pull over when there's a better view ahead
- Stay out of bus lanes and keep off kerbs and pavements and don't stop near traffic islands
- There may be more than one emergency vehicle, so check that it's safe before continuing your journey

At Traffic Lights

An emergency vehicle won't want you to put yourself in danger by going through a red traffic light.

13-15 Bridge Street, Boyup Brook Ph: 9765 1204 Fax: 9765 1113 Email: bbiga@bbiga.com Doing so may mean you're breaking the law (it varies from state to state, and even if it is allowed, you'll need to prove you had good reason to ignore a red light) and ignoring a red light always carries a degree of risk. If you're first in the queue at a red light, stay where you are, and leave the ambulance to find its way around you.

Roundabouts and Junctions

If you're approaching a roundabout or a junction and you see an emergency vehicle with its red-and-blue lights activated, look at its position, as this will let you know where it wants you to go. If you're already at the junction, be patient and wait for it to come past. There may be more than one emergency vehicle approaching, so check before moving off.

Solid White Lines or Double Lines

On a road with a solid white line system, an emergency vehicle will probably switch off its siren (although it may continue to activate its red-and-blue lights) as it closes in on you. This is because overtaking is not allowed and is unsafe. The best thing for you to do is keep going at the speed limit if it's safe – until you're clear of the solid white lines. When the siren goes on again, that's your cue to let the emergency vehicle go past.

Motorways, Freeways and Dual Carriageways

On motorways, freeways and dual carriageways, move to the left to allow an emergency vehicle to pass in the outside lane if it's clear. In slow and stationary traffic, emergency vehicles usually use the motorway hard shoulder, so you should only go onto the hard shoulder if you have an emergency of your own.

Smart Motorways

On a smart motorway (those with overhead lane indicators), one or more lanes may be closed because of an incident ahead – you'll know because of red X signs above the carriageway. Emergency vehicles will use these lanes if they can. Keep out of these red X lanes – it is illegal to use a lane marked with a red X. If no lanes appear to be closed, be prepared to help create the emergency corridor.

In summary: stay calm, make a point of always scanning ahead and behind, to give yourself more time to plan. Don't break the law or take risks, however helpful you're trying to be. Emergency vehicles come in all shapes and sizes so, when you pull over and every time you park, make sure there's sufficient space for any emergency vehicle to get through. Have a good look around and be aware of what everyone else is doing.

Follow these simple guidelines and you'll reduce risk and maybe even help save a life.

Local Picnic Spots

Summer is here and it's time to get out and about in Boyup Brook. We have some wonderful picnic spots within our Shire so shake out the blanket, whip up some sandwiches, and head off to.....

Boyup Brook Billabong

On the banks of the Boyup Brook, this is a gorgeous natural setting where a small pool and rock formations provide a tranquil experience. Access is across the footbridge behind the Railway buildings. On the way down to the water you will find a picnic table where, if you are very lucky and quiet and patient, you may see robin red breasts or blue wrens and other small bird life.

Abel Park

This small park is in the heart of the town on the grounds of the Visitor Information Centre. Facilities include picnic tables, a gazebo, disabled access toilets with baby changing facilities. With a grassed area and beautiful shady trees, this park is close to shops and TRANSWA bus station

Lions Tourist Park

Set on the banks of the Blackwood River on the town side of the bridge on the road to Kojonup, this park has a natural bush setting and provides picnic tables, toilets, water and night lighting.

Sandakan Park

Located behind the Town Hall and right in the middle of town, this park is home to the Sandakan Memorial which honours those prisoners of war who lost their lives in the Borneo Death Marches in WWII. There is a free BBQ, access to a power point and water, gazebo shelters, picnic tables, a large playground under sails, a skateboard rink, three hologram sculptures, and open parkland with wandoo trees. Access to the toilets is behind the Town Hall.


