



TOTAL FIRE BAN versus HARVEST VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

There has been some confusion when it comes to a Total Fire Ban and a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban. To help clarify, let's look at the differences below.

Total Fire Ban



These are issued by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) on days where a fire is most likely to spread rapidly because of extreme fire weather, or if there are already widespread fires and we don't have the resources to fight additional fires. The lighting of open-air fires or any other activity in the open air that is likely to cause a fire is banned. Total Fire Bans affect everyone.

How do you know if a Total Fire Ban has been declared? You can check by

What you need to know about Total Fire Bans

- TFBs are announced either in the afternoon, the day before, or on the actual day.
- TFBs affect farmers, campers, construction workers and residents both urban and rural.
- TFBs usually start at midnight and last for 24 hours.
- · The need for the ban is assessed throughout the day and may be cancelled depending on conditions.
- Exemptions can be granted for some industries and activities.
- Any burning permits held by residents or landowners are fully suspended until the ban is over.
- TFBs are declared using the whole local government boundary.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans



Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are put in place by the local government of the area. Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans may be declared at any time throughout the day as conditions change. If you ignore a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban and cause a fire it could render your insurance invalid and attract a fine of up to \$25,000 and/or a conviction.

The Committee currently comprises of 6 Councillors and 4 voluntary Community Committee members and is chaired by the Shire President.

Background Information

Rylington Park Institute for Agricultural Training and Research (Rylington Park) is located in Mayanup, 27km from Boyup Brook town site on the Boyup Brook-Cranbrook Road. The 650 hectare property was gifted to the Shire of Boyup Brook in 1985 by the late Mr Eric Farleigh for Research and Training in Agriculture and the betterment of Boyup Brook.

The property is managed by the Shire of Boyup who employ staff to operate the farm, host training schools and workshops and coordinate fertiliser and seed trials on the property. Australian Wool Innovation (AWI) provide financial support for Rylington Park to hosts shearing and wool classing schools annually. These training schools attract youth interested in shearing or sheep and wool handling professions, which is important for the sustainability of the sheep industry.

Rylington Park also hosts field days each year, which include 'Storm in a Teacup' Women's Day in March and the Annual Field Day in September.

Rylington Park provides financial support to youth in Boyup Brook who are considering a future in agriculture, by granting scholarships to students attending Agriculture Schools in Year 11 and 12.

25 Years of Hospitality

On January 9, Raema and Richard Chudziak marked a significant milestone – the 25th anniversary of Tulip Cottage, their beloved bed and breakfast accommodation in Boyup Brook.

After purchasing the property in 1991 as an investment, it was initially rented for five years. When the tenant moved out, the couple decided to make improvements and over the next two years it underwent a major facelift.

Raema, a do-it-yourself enthusiast, recalls, "We recycled everything we could," from repurposing wood to crafting a deck balustrade adorned with tulip motifs. These motifs becoming the inspiration behind the cottage's name. The place also had extensive electrical and plumbing upgrades as a part of this refurbishment.

Despite initial plans to rent the property again, Raema's hairdresser sparked the idea of turning it into short-stay accommodation. Richard jumped on board and a phone call to the local Tourism Bureau cemented the idea, as it confirmed that Boyup Brook was in demand of places for visitors to stay.

The journey started with Jean, Barbara Marsh's mother, as the inaugural guest, attending her daughter's wedding to Mark Marsh in January, 1999. By July that year, they also established Boyup Brook Accommodation which began as a Bed and Breakfast in their home.


Over the years, they have adapted to preferences, introducing self-contained units that gained popularity when visitors sought more independent stays.

Today, both Tulip Cottage and Boyup Brook Accommodation continue to thrive, consistently booked and cherished by visitors. Raema and Richard credit their success to teamwork, emphasising they couldn't run the accommodation without each other.

They conscientiously maintain affordable rates to ensure diverse visitors can experience the charm of Boyup Brook. As they celebrate a quarter-century, the couple remains dedicated to enhancing the guest experience, embodying the spirit of hospitality that has defined Tulip Cottage for 25 years.



Pine Plantations in Boyup Brook

The State Government campaign to expand State owned pine plantations in Boyup Brook is progressing as the Forest Products Commission purchases more farming properties to convert to pine plantations. There are local and real Social, Economic and Environmental issues associated with this State Government program to spend \$350m changing land tenure. However, in Boyup Brook we can minimise the impact and generate Local opportunity at the same time.

Consider "Small Lot Forestry" (say 10ha to 40ha - 1 or multiple sites) on your property where you receive annual income from Carbon Credits - that is real dollars in the bank (typically over the last few years around \$600/ha per year for the first 18 years) then at around plantation age 25 years - 30years you receive income from harvest and sale of pine logs according to your production plan. This timber is Primary Production for taxation purposes with the capacity to generate substantial returns.

Some points to note are:

- The Forest Products Commission has historically offered to provide establishment support (such as free seedlings with conditions)
- The Timber Hub "Decision Tree" is a Federal Government support tool to assist with site selection and budgeting
- Industry has offered to provide Carbon Credit accumulation, market and regulation support with conditions
- · Industry can offer options for pine log supply contracts
- · Loss of local families is minimised
- · Income is generated locally which supports increased local expenditure
- · Biosecurity is improved through better pest and weed management by local landowners
- · Water catchments and impact on local water tables is improved
- Fire risks are better managed

Building Drought Resilience

Drought months in the South West are expected to increase by up to 80 per cent in the next 50 years, according to the South West Drought Resilience Adoption and Innovation Hub.

Research demonstrating the heavy socio-economic impact of drought on communities will be presented to community leaders by UWA human science expert Dr Leanne Lester at an online workshop hosted by South West NRM.

The workshop is the first in a series designed to create a Community Resilience Network and connect communities ahead of the predicted increase in drought events.

In her 2022 research report: *Understanding the social impacts of drought*, Dr Lester said drought was not just about a lack of precipitation, but a socio-economic phenomenon.

"The impact of long-term drought can be measured not only in loss of stock and depletion of resources, but also in deterioration of family relationships, loss of community networks, feelings of uncertainty for the future and feelings of being abandoned by the rest of Australia," the report said.

"Indirect economic factors which impact on social outcomes include hardship and stress over lost productivity, a declining population, disruption of social connections, loss of services to the local community and trauma associated with witnessing damage to livestock, crops, soil and native vegetation."

Among seven recommendations made in the report was: "Strengthening community social networks and social capital".

South West NRM Manager Sustainable Agriculture Peter Clifton said the aim of the Community Resilience Network will be to improve capability and collaboration between organisations and groups to reduce harm.


To establish the network, community leaders and volunteers from a broad range of sectors are being sought in six South West shires to participate in local working groups that will champion resilience building and support services.

The aim of the groups will be to:

- Increase community access to suitable support services, especially early intervention tools that help to build individual and community resilience;
- o Share resources and learnings to develop partnerships across the region;
- o Develop plans to further build community resilience.

"We have partnered with CRCs throughout the region to assist with holding a series of six meetings between February and September, 2024 for anyone interested in helping their community," Peter said.





Help After Bushfires

After a major bushfire, the volunteer group BlazeAid calls on volunteers to re-fence farming properties. It takes a few weeks for farmers to obtain the fencing materials required, but there will be a shortage of skilled and unskilled labour to erect the fences.

I spent a week fencing Yarloop properties with BlazeAid after the disastrous 2016 fire, where two lives were lost, and 180 homes along with 200 kilometers of farm fencing destroyed. Persons without fencing experience removed the burnt fencing materials. Those of us with experience worked usually in crews of four people with a 'leader'. At that time I was 78 years old and kept up with most, but left a younger person to attach the bottom wires.

Meals were provided by local organisations. After dinner, each team told of their achievements that day and the response of the farmers. During the socialising after dinner, I detected that about half of the volunteers came from other states in their motorhomes or caravans. Accommodation had been taken by those who had become homeless as a result of the fire.

If there were enough volunteers, a farmer could expect a new fence within a week of application. The coordinator, not the farmer, filled out any forms and that required a signature from the farmer indicating permission to carry out the work.

This could be an opportunity for young people to learn fencing, perhaps with the intention of becoming a fencing contractor. BlazeAid have now expanded their services following other disasters such as floods and storm damage. Their slogan is: "Not just rebuilding fences, but helping rebuild lives".



LiveLighter Recipe Healthy Raspberry Mango Popsicles

Ingredients

- 1 mango
- 1 banana, peeled
- 200 g low-fat mango yoghurt
- 24 raspberries, fresh or frozen



Method

- 1. Place mango, banana and yoghurt into a blender and blend until smooth.
- 2. Put 6 raspberries into each cup and top with mango mix.
- 3. Secure lids on molds or insert popsicle sticks and freeze for 4-6 hours or overnight until solid.
- 4. Stand at room temperature for a few minutes before removing from mould.

Variation:

Place any combination of finely diced fruit into mould including: blueberries, strawberries, seedless watermelon, rockmelon, kiwifruit, drained canned peaches, apricots or pineapple in natural juice, and passionfruit pulp. Top with an unsweetened fruit juice such as orange, pineapple or apple and blackcurrant. For stripes of colour half fill moulds with one fruit, freeze for 4

hours or overnight then fill with a different flavour or colour of fruit or fruit yoghurt before freezing.



Backyard Buddies

Eggfruit Not So Eggsellent!

In a world of Solanaceous garden delights such as capsicums, tomatoes, chillies and eggplants, an unwelcome pest often goes unnoticed until harvest time: *Sceliodes cordalis*, more commonly known as the eggfruit caterpillar. This common garden grub has a craving for plants belonging to the Solanaceae family and can turn your hard-earned produce into a feast for their insatiable appetite.

Biology and management

Eggfruit caterpillars begin their journey when the small brown moth lays her tiny, white oval eggs. These eggs are predominantly laid on the stem or calyx of the developing fruit. They hatch tiny white ravenous caterpillars, which bore into the fruit through the stem or calyx. This disguises their entry point. Munching and pooing their way through the inside of the fruit, the caterpillars often turn bright pink or red in colour as they mature.

Eggfruit caterpillars are particularly hard to detect as there's rarely any external signs of infestation of the fruit. These gluttonous grubs eventually chew their way out of the fruit to pupate, and later emerge as adult moths.



Controlling this pest can be challenging and requires well-timed management during all life stages. Make sure to remove any weeds from the Solanaceous family (e.g., nightshade) to reduce their breeding sources in the garden.

Moths and eggs can be controlled using light traps, or by spraying insecticidal soap on the calyx. These soaps can affect the delicate wings of the adult moth, making it too slippery for her eggs to stick to the calyx, and may also desiccate the eggs.

As freshly hatched caterpillars, there is a very short window for control before they enter the fruit. Target the stems and calyx with caterpillar control products. Look for ingredients such as spinosad or the biological control 'BT' (*Bacillus thruigiensis*). These insecticides become virtually ineffective once the caterpillars burrow into the fruit, as they are well-protected inside. If infested fruit is found, remove and discard to break their lifecycle.

Report your capsicum criminals!

Although eggfruit caterpillars are a well-established species, it's the small white caterpillars that may be confused with the larvae of the non-established and reportable Queensland fruit fly (Qfly). Qfly is a significant pest of over 300 fruits and vegetables.

You can report suspicious larvae in your produce to MyPestGuide or contact the Pest and Disease Information Service by sending in photos of the larvae and cut-open fruits. Report early to keep your Solanaceous garden delights safe from unwelcome feasters!

Visit the Collections Room

Visit the Collections Room at the Boyup Brook Visitor Centre, and be mesmerised by the thousands of beetles and butterflies that make up the <u>Carnaby Beetle and Butterfly Collection</u>. Many insects in the collection are now more than 50 years old but still show their jewel-like colours. This collection was part of a much bigger collection accumulated by Keith Carnaby, a past resident of Wilga.

Recently, the Collections Room has become home to part of an Egg Collection of Ivan Carnaby, a brother of Keith Carnaby. Ivan was a superb bushman and travelled all over the state. A small part of a private collection of his birds eggs was offered to Boyup Brook, and is now housed alongside our other collections.

The <u>Carnaby Black Cockatoo</u>, which is a threatened species, is named after Ivan. This large black cockatoo (also known as the Shortbilled Black-Cockatoo) has white tail panels, white cheek patches and a short bill. They can live 35years, possibly longer. Look out for them this time of year.



Geology enthusiasts will enjoy the varied array of Western Australian rocks on display including the 'Landscape Jasper', so called due to the fascinating markings on the polished face.



Also in the Collections Room is the <u>Kradal Doll Collection</u>. Ede Tuckett had over 700 dolls in her collection at her home in Chowerup. On moving to Perth in 2005, she was unable to take all her treasured dolls with her, she donated a part of her collection to the Boyup Brook Visitor Centre so that people could continue to enjoy them.

The Collections Room is accessible to the public during Visitor Centre opening hours.

Once All The Fun Of The Country Music Festival Is Over Wander the Blackwood River Arts Trail



We continue our cycle of monthly messages for 2024 with the message for January 1, 2008 for our prayer groups and personal reflection.

Jesus

I am always with you, dear apostles. You move through your days of service learning greater and greater lessons in holiness. I am the teacher. The plan that I have for you includes suffering, and your holiness will increase because of your crosses. I do not rejoice in the suffering of my friends. No, I do not. I do rejoice in the willingness of my friends to suffer, for me and with me. This will never change.

My gratitude toward each of my beloved apostles increases as each day's commitment flows into the past. A stream of allegiance pledges trail behind you as you proceed into tomorrow. Be at peace in your crosses, I beg you, because your crosses benefit you in ways that you cannot understand. It must be enough for you that the Saviour understands.

If you are weary, do not be afraid. You will have what you require to cope and I will sustain you. I was weary, also. If you falter, do not be discouraged. I faltered, also. I will lift you back to your feet. There are no circumstances that should cause you to be anxious because just as you pledge your allegiance to the Father, I, the Saviour, pledge my allegiance to you. Be Still and Know..... God

Set Healthy Boundaries

'Our word to you does not waver between "Yes" and "No".' 2 Corinthians 1:18 NLT

As you step into a new year, let it be a new you. Do you find yourself trying to please others, afraid to be yourself. Paul writes, 'Do you think I make my plans carelessly? Do you think I am like people ... who say "Yes" when they really mean "No"? As surely as God is faithful, our word to you does not waver' (2 Corinthians 1:17-18 NLT). Paul had learned to set boundaries in his relationships, and you must do the same.

A wise man said, 'Never complain about what you permit.' Unless you set boundaries, you have no right to complain about people who take advantage of you and waste your time. 'Jesus ... does not waver between "Yes" and "No" ... He always does what He says' (2 Corinthians 1:19 NLT). You must learn when it's appropriate to say yes and when it's appropriate to say no.

When people back you into a corner, confront them promptly, privately, and personally. And if they won't listen, take someone with you. And if they won't listen to both of you, take it to the church leadership (see Matthew 18:15-17). Be clear about what you will and won't tolerate. In the words of the country song, 'You've got to stand for something or you'll fall for anything.' Get comfortable voicing your wishes and preferences without fear of rejection and alienation.

Make this your prayer today: 'Lord, help me to live from a place of accepting myself, rather than a need for love and acceptance of others. Help me to no longer live in fear of being myself. This has prevented me from setting healthy boundaries. I place my trust in You. (see Psalm 56:11). In Jesus' name. Amen.'


